

Paradigm: Everyone Can Be A Leader

Achieving growth in these areas would ultimately impact students in the following ways:

- The partnership between school and home will be strengthened and engagement in their child's learning will increase.
- Students will take responsibility for their actions and emotions and prioritize the things that are most important to their future.

DO: Lead Measures/Strategies

- Principal reports on 7 Habits at school council meetings and monthly newsletter.
- Parent information nights on supporting students current needs
 - Experts from need identified by parents/staff
- Numeracy Night(s)
- Literacy Nights(s)
- School Principal will meet with community groups to solicit project ideas
- School Council discussion re: leadership opportunities
- Granum students will increase their involvement in community service and citizenship activities (food bank donations, food bank drive, snow shoveling, raking leaves, volunteer at community fundraisers, etc)

EMBEDDED STRATEGIES

- Focus on developing student leadership opportunities through 7 Habits/Leader in Me
- Synergy periods and Synergy Thursday's provide an element of student choice and expanded programming.
- Participation in delivering breakfast and nutrition programming to ensure students have access to healthy options each day.
- Student Leadership Club to develop activities for all students to participate in (expanding to include and mentor students from younger ages)
- Gather student/parent input into Synergy Activities.
- Increased emphasis on student leadership roles both in classrooms and throughout the school. (Individual classroom leadership roles)

- Continuation of the Granum Greatness challenge students are recognized for being leaders at the school. This will expand to include a weekly 7 Habit focus that recognizes students for their work on those habits.
- Monthly Assemblies led by the leadership group.
- Recognition of STAR students by staff members of a student who demonstrated strong leadership skills throughout the previous month in each division.
- Recognition of student(s) who demonstrated the 7 Habit goal of previous month, chosen by leadership group, at monthly assembly. When student(s) are chosen a picture is taken and added to the 7 Habit tree in the common area to inspire other students to achieve success in demonstrating the 7 Habits at all times.
- Grade 9 led experiential learning day.

Paradigm: Change starts with me.

Achieving growth in these areas would ultimately impact students in the following ways:

 Where appropriate, students will feel and be a significant part of school decision making and be part of the school team.

DO: Lead Measures/Strategies

- Increased FNMI awareness (led by staff FNMI committee member) (invite community members in to lead activities)
- Focus on expanding extra-curricular opportunities for students building on basketball and track & field from last year
- Involvement of Family School Liaison Counselor (FSLC) on Professional Development days to allow for collaboration between FSLC and teaching staff
- Monday announcements recognizing students that received Granum Greatness
- Student 7 Habit presentations at monthly assembly
 - o Recognize students that exemplify monthly habit on 7 Habits tree
- Teachers will make a personal communication with families monthly
- Provide opportunities and invitations for community members to be involved in the Granum Experiential Learning Day
- School council meetings will include an agenda item focusing on "How can parents be more involved"
- At least bi-weekly make use of features of the school website (ie. blog, calendar, Facebook, posting newsletter etc.) to promote the great things happening at Granum School
- Focus on developing Skills in Leadership
 - o Leadership Culture in classes (ie. class jobs, grouping roles)
- Focus on Skills in Synergizing
 - o Buddy Block, Synergy groups, project groupings with roles
- Focus on Citizenship
 - o O'Canada, community awareness projects (ie. playground clean-ups, food drive, pop tab, snow shoveling), celebrate citizenships
 - o student/teacher created mission statements
 - recognition of non-school student accomplishments in assemblies and announcements

EMBEDDED STRATEGIES

- Cross grade groupings to develop relationships between all students and all staff; although we will keep students in their cohorts this year (grades 5-9 and K-4).
- Timetable to allow students to work with a variety of staff throughout the day
- Granum Greatness challenge students are recognized for going above and beyond what is expected
- Monthly Assembly to celebrate student achievement
- Community members will be used for a weekly 1-1 reading

Edsby's tools were used minimally, however in place of that communication piece, each teacher sent home regular emails updating parents on what was happening in class and gave personal notes on a child's progress.

Imagine Everything was utilized more than in the past to give evidence of student learning, however full use of its capabilities still needs improvement.

Goal Achievement | Academics Self-Efficacy

Paradigm: Everyone has genius.

Achieving growth in these areas would ultimately impact students in the following ways:

- Teachers are able to support their students in learning and applying the behaviors linked to effective goal achievement.
- Communication between school and home will increase to allow parents/ guardians to better support their children in their learning.

DO: Lead Measures

- Provide ongoing training and support for staff on Guided Reading interventions and Fountas and Pinnell assessment
- Provide opportunities for teachers to attend literacy and numeracy Professional Development. Staff will share learning with staff on Professional Development days (Divisional committees and PD of choice)
- Collaboration time on Professional Development days to share strategies and knowledge
- Partnership with PAL to provide extra reading support to identified students
- Analysis of standardized tests to examine areas of need for instruction
- Use of UFLI and as an early literacy core assessment tool.
- Use of Numeracy assessments (Equals) to inform instruction and planning for individual students
- Use of Mathletics, and Math Zorbits as an assessment, reinforcement and engagement tool
- Literacy and/or Numeracy night with student and parent involvement
- Staff will examine pedagogical and assessment strategies in a multi-aged classroom
- Staff will make full use of Edsby's tools to increase communication and provide evidence of students work for parents
- ISP's will be updated each month for better tracking and development of students progress
- Conduct a student summit to break down survey results and increase understanding of the data
- Students will set and track their own academic WIGs and staff will work with students to help them achieve and celebrate their goals
 - Staff will pursue PD on student portfolios best practices

PAT results will improve from very low on the Accountability Surveys.

EMBEDDED STRATEGIES

- Students have additional time each week to improve their numeracy (Mathletics/Math Zorbits) and their literacy (D.E.A.R) skills.
- School wide scoreboard to track students progress in achieving their reading goals.
